Prayer	<p>Fr. Boban Vattampurath led us in prayer, also paying special respect to the recently departed Fr. Joseph Manapuram, as well as the first KCCNA President, Mr. Abraham Niravath, who passed away recently.</p>
Oath of office	<p>There was one NC member present who had not taken the Oath of Office. President James Illikal led Johny Illikattil from Atlanta in taking the Oath of Office.</p>
Agenda overview	<p>Vipin Chalungal explained today's agenda items.</p>
Welcome Message	<p>Matt Vilangattucheril, KCS Chicago Vice President, welcomed everyone to the NC meeting in Chicago in the absence of KCS Chicago President, Jose Anamala.</p>
Presidential Address	<p>President James Illikal gave a message in which he appreciated all the NC members who joined in person, as well as KCS Chicago for hosting. He requested active participation and a productive meeting. <p>KCYLNA Update</p>	<p>Alvin Pinarkayil provided an overview of the various events that were executed over the past months:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● St. Patrick's Day event in Chicago ● 10K National Basketball event in New York ● Takeover events in Texas, California, and another one in Chicago today ● Supported the start of a Western Ontario KCYL Unit <p>Alvin thanked the NC for all their support.</p> <p>Sneha Palapuzhamattam gave a detailed activity report on the many initiatives KCYLNA has been able to execute during their term. She also provided an update on the upcoming KCYLNA Summit in Atlanta, Georgia, with registration starting shortly.</p> <p>President Alvin Pinarkayil also provided an overview of KCYLNA's accounts. KCWFNA Update	<p>Maria Kaitharam provided an overview of the Activity Report, highlighting various ongoing activities such as seminars (Wills & Trusts), chain rosary, charity work, and various competitions to engage the Women's Forum members.</p> <p>She noted that planning is in the final stages for the KCWFNA Summit, with over 350 participants expected in Mexico.</p> <p>Additionally, two upcoming seminars are planned, as well as the National Council meeting in November.</p>
KCYNA Updates	<p>Luke Kunnel and Punnoose Vanchipurackal provided updates.</p> <p>Luke Kunnel provided an activity report on various ongoing initiatives, with a focus on the upcoming Knanayam 2025 in Orlando. Registration has been successful, with approximately 225 participants expected.</p> <p>One challenge being faced is that local KCS associations have rules requiring membership in the associations for registration, which has created difficulties for many youth. This was discussed briefly, and local associations were requested to consider how best to address this situation, with the focus on increasing participation. This is a local decision and should be discussed within each unit.</p> <p>Yuvajanavedhi is celebrating 25 years since its inception, and this milestone is being recognized as part of the celebrations.</p> <p>A financial overview of KCYNA activities was also provided.</p> <p>KCYNA President Punnoose Vanchipurackal spoke specifically about Knanayam 2025 and highlighted some of the new initiatives planned as part of this event.</p>
Treasurers Report	<p>Jojo Tharayil started by thanking the previous EC for ensuring a smooth handover.</p> <p>Jojo provided an overview of the various KCCNA and sub-organization accounts, which had also been included in the registration package for all NC members in attendance.</p> <p>Jobin Marangattil and Stephen Kidarathil asked a few questions, and responses were provided.</p> <p>There was a discussion about convention souvenirs. General feedback suggested that the souvenir should be released within six months or provided as</p>

	<p>a digital copy.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Proposed by: Shaji Palliveettil ● Secoded by: Kennedy Enchanattil <p>Jojo also provided an overview of legal expenditures to date. A total of \$77,991 has been spent across multiple terms. This was a follow-up item from the last NC meeting.</p>
<p>KYA Update</p>	<p>Dr. Susan Thengumtharayil provided an update on KYA topics.</p> <p>The goal is to organize activities for young adults to help them build connections.</p> <p>A strong group of young adults has come forward to help organize these activities. The first event is planned to step slightly outside the usual format, focusing on providing more opportunities for interaction. A tentative location in Montreal has been identified for this event.</p> <p>Another activity is also being considered in Las Vegas.</p>
<p>BC Canada Unit Approval</p>	<p>Minu Kodunninam Kunnel provided an overview of the association and its details. The unit has requested full inclusion of the association in KCCNA and has provided all necessary documentation for this.</p> <p>The quorum required to make constitutional changes is 50% (73). The quorum for this meeting was only 68; therefore, the NC was not able to officially approve the association's inclusion in KCCNA.</p> <p>The constitution was reviewed and it was confirmed that in an NC meeting held at least 30 days from now, this matter can be brought up with a lower quorum. The EC will confirm this with the Legal Advisors before the next NC meeting.</p>
<p>Convention Presentation</p>	<p>Jaimol Moosariparambil, Arun Powathil, and Joby Uralil provided an overview of the convention facility in Fort Lauderdale. The convention center was identified after a thorough search and offers the best opportunity for a successful convention.</p> <p>The convention center contract has been signed, and a kitchen buyout has been negotiated.</p> <p>An overview video of the convention center was played for NC members. A financial projection for the convention has also been assembled and shared with those present. Jaimol emphasized that the success of the convention depends</p>

on everyone working together to meet our goals, especially regarding sponsorship.

NC members asked several clarifying questions, with responses provided as follows:

- Has the second hotel been contracted? No contract has been signed, but preliminary talks have taken place.
- Rooms: 600 rooms have been blocked at the Omni.
- Siblings (married): Considered as a separate family.
- If we exceed 600 rooms, can local Miami associations stay at their homes? So far, this has not been considered; the preference is for all participants to stay at the hotel.
- Walking distance from the second hotel: 5 minutes.
- Registration start: Please ensure registration begins in October 2025.
- Sit-down dinner instead of buffet: This would increase registration costs by over \$100.
- Banquet duration: Request to keep it as short as possible.

Discussions have already taken place between the Miami and Tampa units. The agreement reached is that the Convention Chair will be from Tampa, with a co-chair from the Miami unit.

Rajan Padavathil proposed passing the convention proposal, including hosting by Miami and the dates of August 6–10.

Case Updates

Siju Cheruvankalayil started by expressing his gratitude to Chicago KCS for organizing the NC meeting, as well as to our Spiritual Director, Fr. Boban Vattampurath, for fully joining us today.

Navikarana Samithi:

- The court case has not been posted and has been pending for some time.

Circular-related case filed by KCCNA:

- We have an interim injunction from last October.
- Kottayam AD has not filed an appeal yet, so the status quo continues.

Jimmy Kunnacherry mentioned that there was an update on this case this past Thursday. He also noted that the lawyer working for KCCNA had previously handled the Biju Uthuppu case. He questioned the value of KCCNA being involved in this case, noting the additional expenses it would incur. He asked if the NC had any concerns about not being part of the cases and requested the NC consider that option, especially since DKCC is also pursuing similar efforts.

President James Illikal provided high-level feedback, stating that the administration does not intend to spend any significant amount on the court cases going forward.

John Vilangattusseril provided an update on the reasons why the Navikarana Samithi case was filed several years ago. He expressed his preference to let the trial continue, provided there are no major pending expenses. He noted that the previous administration under Shaji Edat had already spent 12 lakhs toward this cause. Regarding the Circular-related case, he stated it could end if the bishop withdraws the existing order.

Shaji Edat clarified that only 1 lakh has been spent on the Circular-related case; the rest was for the Navikarana Samithi case. He emphasized the importance of continuing case efforts for the existence of KCCNA. He also clarified that Srikumar Sir only spent a few hours on the Biju Uthuppu case in court and has not otherwise represented Biju Uthuppu, which is normal for a lawyer.

Divya Vallippadavil provided feedback that the previous decisions regarding the case were made by the then NC, based on the understanding that the case challenged our “Janmam and Karmam” policy. She requested that the NC not devalue those previous decisions.

Celin Charath commented that KCCNA being involved in two cases—one with the AD and one against—can be confusing for the younger generation.

Phils Mappalasseril suggested that KCCNA consider optimizing its involvement in

	<p>the cases, possibly by supporting efforts without being a direct party.</p> <p>Babu Thaiparambil expressed that, currently, even the Navikarana Samithi case is unlikely to have a positive impact and asked whether KCCNA can do something to help our Bishop reconsider his decision.</p> <p>James Illikal expressed that from the AD only “Janmam” is being presented as a requirement for being Knanaya.</p> <p>Jimmy Kunnacherry requested that the KCCNA EC not spend any more money towards the Navikarana Samithi case.</p> <p>Jayamol Moosariparambil expressed that the challenge is that in the US is that we don’t have the same terms as in Kottayam. She requested some feedback from Boban Achen on the same topic.</p>
<p>Update from Bobban Achen - KCCNA Spiritual Director</p>	<p>Bobban Achen provided a positive message to the NC members, appreciating the efforts of all leaders and sub-organizations, especially in many of the religious initiatives.</p> <p>He spoke about his involvement in past conventions and expressed his happiness that clergy and religious segments have been part of these events. He emphasized his desire for a conflict-free path toward the upcoming convention.</p> <p>Regarding the court cases, he mentioned that the Navikarana Samithi case is very important and that the Kottayam AD will continue to pursue it to the fullest extent. He expressed satisfaction that KCCNA is supporting this effort.</p> <p>Regarding the Circular-related case, he explained that the circular was based on canon law. While it brings strong emotions for members, it essentially states that the circular does not prevent members from maintaining their relationship with the Kottayam AD. For example, if a member returns to Kottayam for three months, they can once again be part of that parish.</p> <p>He also shared that Bishop Moolakatt has emphasized in several associations that the presence of churches in the U.S. is due to strong Knanaya associations. The Knanaya Personal Parish was specifically created by Rome for our people in the U.S. and is exclusively for Knanaya members.</p> <p>James Illikal provided feedback that the challenge lies within the “Janmam & Karmam” issue.</p> <p>Bobban Achen clarified that, according to the “Sabha Niyamam,” Karmam can be a challenge; however, our churches manage this by politely asking those who marry outside the community to join the non-Knanaya parish.</p>
<p>DKCC Update.</p>	<p>DKCC Secretary Augustin Puthenpura was invited to the NC meeting to</p>

	<p>participate; however, he was unable to attend. Instead, he provided a report, which was read by Joy Paradiyil from New York.</p> <p>The report included updates about the cases DKCC is involved in. He emphasized that the community should work together to achieve our goals, particularly concerning church structure, and that our actions are intended to ensure a bright future for the next generation of Knanaya members.</p> <p>James Illikal provided an update regarding the DKCC court case and the request for the KCCNA Secretary and President to become part of DKCC. Since this would violate the KCCNA constitution, an amicable proposal was suggested: the elected delegate from Chicago (Sajan Pachilamackil) would step back, and Vipin Chalungal KCCNA Secretary, also from Chicago, would become a DKCC delegate. This approach satisfies the requirements of both constitutions.</p> <p>Sajan officially expressed that he will resign so that Vipin Chalungal can represent the region in DKCC.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Proposed by: Xavier Chirayil ● Seconded by: Johny Illikattil
<p>Other Items</p>	<p>Financial Sub Committee:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Some volunteers were requested; however, no NC members volunteered from the floor. The EC will try to fill this committee, as it is very much needed for a bright KCCNA future. <p>Invitation for Clergy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Jimmy Kunnacherry explained that if there is a need to invite the Bishop to the next Convention to hear a similar statement as the previous Convention, at least the NC members should be informed in advance about who is being invited to the Convention. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ James Illikal cited the portion of the constitution that states the position of the Kottayam Bishop and how we cannot violate the constitution. Hence, not inviting the Bishop would require a constitutional change. ● Joy Paradiyil expressed that the intent should be to invite but not pay for their expenses. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ This will be based on the convention and the financial availability at the time and is to be reviewed. James Illikal also expressed that maybe we can look at not providing a "donation." ○ A quick show of hands was requested to see if anyone else supports not paying for guests' tickets. No other hands were raised.

Study on virtual meetings:

- We need a committee to study the feasibility of incorporating virtual meetings with more details in the constitution. Making major decisions is one example.
- Berny Mullapallil and Kennedy Enchanattil have expressed their interest.

Long term planning on how to identify convention centers:

- So that we can plan better for future conventions, how can we structure our constitution? This needs to be studied.
- Volunteers were requested from the NC, but no one stepped forward. The EC will attempt to find members.

Souvenir related discussion:

- Currently, there are challenges with how quickly it is released. Maybe moving to a digital format could be a good option.
- The general feedback was that it should be released relatively quickly regardless of the format.
- Another proposed option is to make it digital with an additional fee for a hard copy.

Committee to help make progress on Church/Community topics:

- Babu Thaiparambil explained that we should have a committee to look into what actions KCCNA should take on these matters (long term).
- The proposal is a good one, and we can look into how best to implement it.
- Boban Achen provided various clarifications regarding the Syro Malabar Diocese and our part in it.

How to improve our community (Salby Makil):

- While church topics are important, we also need to put enough emphasis on how to improve our community. We need to add such topics to the agenda as well.
- One cause may be the way we conduct our elections, and this should be considered.

NC unanimously agreed that the \$100 fee mentioned in the constitution for missing two consecutive NC meetings should be enforced in the future.

Some concerns were brought up regarding churches and associations working together. Several examples were mentioned and also discussed with Boban Achen. Boban Achen expressed that he is listening and will bring up some of these topics in the next meeting with the Achens.
